

# GCSE-Level Serbian Course in London

The Round Table is pleased to announce that, once again, it intends to run a Serbian Language course that meets GCSE standards, from late September 2017. Although the course does not offer a recognised qualification it has been designed by academics and language teachers to meet the requirements set out by Ofqual (the government body responsible for examinations in England).

This is a great opportunity for young people to develop their knowledge of the Serbian language and Serbian culture and to make new friends.

**Who:** Pupils aged 12 + who have a working knowledge of Serbian in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Candidates will be given short tests in these 4 skills before being accepted on the course.

**When:** Saturday afternoons from 14.00 - 17.00 beginning on 30 September 2017 and finishing in February 2019 i.e. four full terms, although the course will run over 5 school terms.

**Where:** Bishop Nikolaj Community Centre, 89 Lancaster Road, London W11 1QQ

**Fees:** £240 per pupil for the four terms, payable at the beginning of the course. If fees are paid on a termly basis an additional fee of £10 will be charged per term to cover the additional administrative costs involved. A distance learning option is also available for a fee of £150. For this pupils will receive

materials for the course, have their homework marked and queries addressed. There is also an Exam Entrance fee of £40.

The course is largely funded by the fees paid by pupils and so pupils starting the course should do so on the understanding that they will complete the course.

**Staffing:** The course will be taught by qualified, experienced teachers.

**Examiners:** Dr David Norris and Dr Vladislava Ribnikar, from the School of Russian and Slavonic Studies, University of Nottingham, in their personal capacities, will act as external examiners.

**Certification:** Pupils who complete the course and pass the exams, will be issued with a certificate from the Serbian Council of Great Britain which they can include in their School Record of Achievement.
